Through their time and leadership Gretna was again named a Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation. We are one around 3,600 communities nationwide that prioritize trees in our community and it shows.

Year in Review for '22

This last year was a fantastic year for our community. We added businesses such as Fareway, Casey's, Heavy Brewing, Good Life Sports Bar, Stories Coffee, First National Bank and REI to name a few. Announced 2 new fiber providers who will deliver high speed internet to our community. We issued 1,273 building permits, versus 304 the previous year. We lowered our tax levy for the first time in 13 years. As our community continues to grow, we are focusing on meeting the infrastructure demands, scaling our services to match the needs of the citizens, keeping our quality of life, while continuing our culture of being fiscally conservative. Gretna Crossing Park

As the excitement continues to build we shift from building this great park, to opening it. The park is on schedule to open this coming September. We began immediately after the passing of the 2 funding elections in later 2020. In spite of a global pandemic, unprecedented supply chain challenges and labor shortages our partners and staff have done a fantastic job of delivering a generational park. We have raised over \$2 million dollars in corporate sponsorships to help minimize the tax payer burden on its maintenance. As construction winds down we will be releasing more information on Opening Weekend.



Pickleball Anyone

The 6 new pickleball courts are now open. This sport offers individuals of all skills and ages to enjoy being active outdoors and meeting others. If you are a member of the library, you can check out a pickelball kit with instructions, paddles and balls. Give it a try!

Roads and Construction

Adding housing options and bringing new businesses is exciting, but it also creates a lot of demands on the roads and infrastructure. Roads that a few years ago were lightly travelled are now becoming main corridors for daily traffic. We are working diligently with Sarpy County, NDOT and local developers to keep up with the demands. All these entities understand the need and urgency to improve our road network. We appreciate your patience through the planning, construction and delivery of these projects. Two big projects are being completed this year, first being the Connect Sarpy Project opening 180th north and Cornhusker to the west. The second is the opening of 204th Street to Capehart and then Capehart to Highway 6/31 later this summer.

Library

Like so many of our community's services, infrastructure and resources our library has become much too small to serve our community, especially considering Gretna is forecast to be over 50,000 by area planers by 2050. Library's built now are much different than the libraries of the past. New libraries include a variety of programs, resources and knowledge. The Library Foundation has been completing their community outreach to see what resources and services the residents of Gretna feel are most important. They will be sharing the results of this survey soon.

Safety & Service

Thank you to our Sarpy County Sherriff department for their increased presence in our community and surrounding roads. Also, big <u>Thank You</u> to our volunteer Fire & Emergency services team. Four years ago these volunteers made 1,077 calls and in 2022 they made over 1,400 (an average of 4 calls/day). Their leadership understands our community will continue to grow and to support that they will need to begin hiring a full time crew for Emergency Medical Services. While a bigger financial commitment from the City is required, it is important we provide these often life saving services very timely.
